## **Overseeding**



- Ethos Enterprises was selected to recoat the stamped asphalt crosswalks at the six CPV neighborhood entrances and at the pool. The planned start date of the 4-5 day project is October 24, weather dependent. Gate access will be slightly modified at each entrance during the work.
- Bogardus Engineering was chosen to survey the storm drainage-ways throughout Center Pointe. This was
  recommended by the Town of Oro Valley to identify and remediate water flow issues that may exist now or in the
  future. The report will give suggested actions for things needing immediate attention, or to be incorporated into
  the landscape maintenance plan.
- Maintenance items being considered coming up include painting of pool structures, splash pad, ramadas, and large common area tree trimming.
- The Board voted to open the Center Pointe Pool at 5:00am, for a four month trial.
- The equipment noise at the pool recently was the sound of a failing pump motor. A new one has been installed. The original motor put in by the builder in 2016 had an expected lifespan of six years.
- When the emergency shut off button located behind the spa is triggered, it stops the pump resulting in a lack of
  circulation in the spa and the pool. This causes a degradation of the water quality which is time consuming and
  expensive for the pool vendor to remedy. Please report to Mission any misuse of the emergency system, the
  button is not to be pressed unless it is an Emergency.
- The pool service provider has recommended draining the pool to reduce the volume of chemicals needed to maintain the water. Draining and refilling may take up to two weeks. Once we receive guidance from the pool company that the required ambient weather conditions are favorable, we will provide a projected pool closure date. The annual pool tile cleaning will likely be done at the same time.

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
